Welcome Message

From the Education Director, Andy Graham

I would like to begin by saying happy Spring to all of our families and community members. Though it may not seem like it, Summer is just around the corner and warmer weather is on its way. As we move from Spring into Summer, many exciting programs will be happening at the Education Centre.

This summer, the Seventh Fire Secondary Program will be offering two great courses to any interested, high school aged, band and community members. The first course, called Green Technologies, will run during the months of May and June in the evening and on weekends. The class will also be building a greenhouse at the Education Centre this summer. We are planning for this to occur in early July. The second course will focus on Indigenous and traditional knowledge.

We are accepting registrations for the Secondary Program for the 2019-2020 school year. If you or someone in your family is interested in registering for the summer course(s) or for the Fall, please contact Dawn May at 699-0233, ext. 801. We would be pleased to send out a registration package or it can also be downloaded from the website.

As part of our program development, Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation is working on a comprehensive Immersion Education Model which will largely focus on interactive language development. The model, consisting of an overall Early Years to Grade 8 framework, along with specific community language/cultural benchmarks, will be completed in early June. The model will also be an integral part of the new JK-SK curriculum also being developed by our planning team. The instructional approach will focus on experiential and land-based programming.

The Lac des Mille Lacs Education Centre will also begin accepting registrations for our new elementary school. As you are aware, starting in September 2019, Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation will be offering classes in the JK/SK program. Depending on numbers of registered children, parents will have the option of choosing the Anishinaabe Immersion program, Cree Immersion program or a non-immersion, land-based program. The school will be open to all band and community family members, as well as any student in Thunder Bay. We welcome all children! Transportation will be made available to families throughout the city. Off-site registration opportunities will occur throughout the Spring and Summer. Native Language Program

Beginner Ojibwe Language Class

Do you want to learn to speak Ojibwe? Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation offers free language classes.

The classes run:

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the Lac des Mille Lacs Education Centre which is located on 2040 Walsh Street East (formally Hyde Park School). The last day of our Language Class will be on Wednesday June 26th, 2019.

These classes are OPEN to Elders, adults, youth, children and toddlers who want to learn basic Ojibwe. The classroom instructions include some of the following lessons: Greetings, Days of the Week, Months, Weather, Numbers, Colors, Animals, and simple verbs.

Students are expected to use the Double Vowel Writing System when completing writing & reading assignments. Oral reviews are done daily. Special one-on-one attention is given to our youth and children by the Ojibwe teacher.

Teachings activities have included quizzes, reading, writing, games and traditional activities such as hand drumming and singing. In our sharing circles, we make use of some of the Ojibwe vocabulary taught in class.

If you have always wanted to learn to speak Ojibwe - then this is the class for you!



Are you 22 years or older and seeking to acquire your high school diploma?

Lac des Mille Lacs First Nation will be starting an **Adult Education Pilot Program in September 2019** at the Education Centre.

The Adult Education pilot program will be delivered via quality classroom-based instruction from Monday to Friday offering the academic credits you require for your high school diploma and in order to further your goals of post secondary education.

The PLAR (Prior Learning and Recognition Assessment) and SEA (Senior Equivalency Assessment) assessments will be offered in our program. These assessment tools will evaluate what learning and work/life experiences you have received outside of the education system that can potentially earn you additional academic credits; which will help you to reach your education dream sooner.

If this opportunity interests you, come visit us at the Education Centre to register. Don't forget to bring your personal identification and your high school transcript to accompany your registration form.

There will be 2 session times offered to work on your academic credits where you can select one or both sessions (suited to your schedule).
